



## The Next Phase: P.Log. Certification Requirements Change January 1, 2005

On January 1, 2005, our third phase of certification requirements will be implemented. To earn the P.Log., candidates must complete the new National Qualifying Examination in addition to all 6 modules in the Standard Certification Program.

### Certification Requirements: 1994 - Present

Phase 1: 1994 – 2000	Phase 2: 2001-2004	Phase 3: 2005 – et sq.
Standard Program: 4 modules Advanced standing available 5 years experience	Standard Program: 6 modules No advanced standing 5 years experience	Standard Program: 6 modules National Qualifying Exam 5 years experience

At each stage, the Institute phased in new certification requirements allowing current or ‘in process’ candidates to complete their requirements within a reasonable timeframe before new policies came into effect. The same approach applies to new requirements in Phase 3, most notably the National Qualifying Exam. The following scenarios apply:

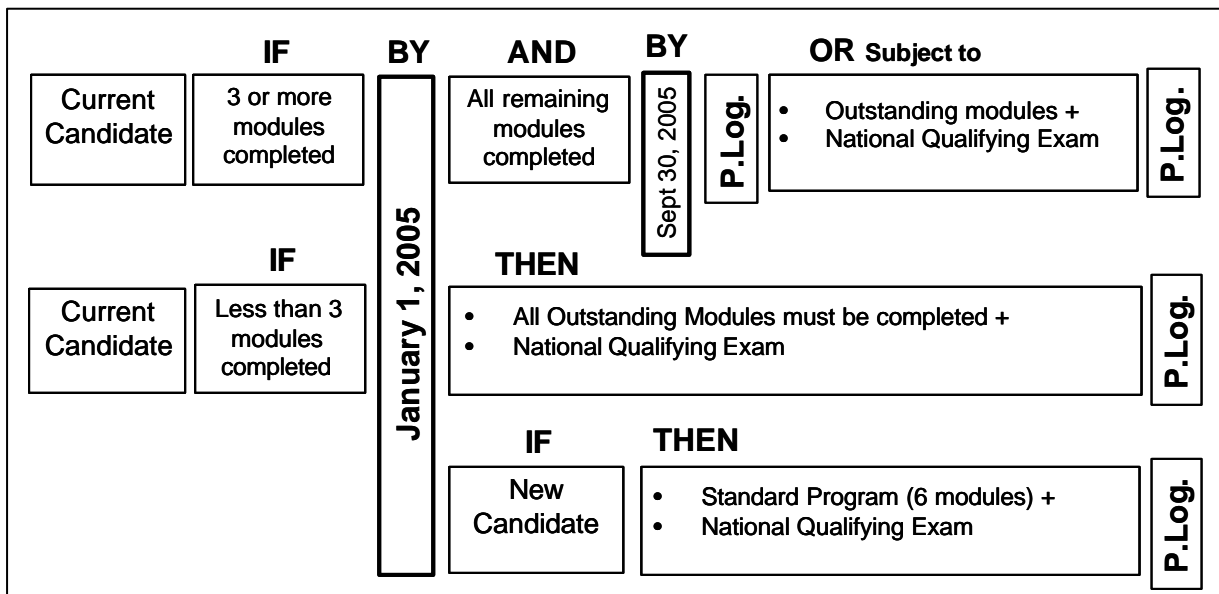
### Current Candidates

If you complete 3 or more modules by January 1, 2005, and complete all remaining modules by September 30, 2005, then you earn the P.Log. However, if you complete 3 or more modules by January 1, 2005 but do not complete remaining modules by September 30, 2005, then you must complete the National Qualifying Exam in addition to all remaining modules.

If you complete fewer than 3 modules by January 1, 2005, then you must complete the National Qualifying Exam in addition to all remaining modules to earn the P.Log.

### New Candidates

New Candidates starting after January 1, 2005 must complete all six modules of the Standard Program and the National Qualifying Exam to earn the P.Log.
